

Share of Irish food and drink exports destined for the UK by category, 2016 (%)






UK Beef Market (2016 data)

- Population: 65 million
- Beef Consumption: 1,193,000 t. (18.2kg/capita)
- Beef Production: 914,000 t.
- Imports 421,000 t. / Exports 142,000 t.
- Ireland supplies 70% of UK beef imports
- Supplying key retail and foodservice customers
- Product profile well-matched: steer/heifer, grass-based, QA

Beef Imports to the UK (Fresh & Frozen) by supplying country - 2016



Top 3 retailers account for almost 50% volume share of beef






British Cattle Price Development in Sterling terms

Britain: Focus on British and Irish Beef commonality in the market

Germany: New Sustainability campaign targeting high potential customers

Netherlands: Protect position by focusing on welfare and "raised at grass"

Italy: Premium positioning based on taste, sustainability, natural

Other EU and International: Exploit opportunities for growth & diversification



Brexit - the Great Unknown

- Early days: initial focus on "divorce" arrangements
 to incl. financial commitments to EU, immigration & borders
- Phase 2 will outline the future UK-EU relationship
- Worst-case scenario (no agreement): "WTO rules" tariff rates of €3/kg plus 12.8% of value (boneless cuts)
- This would equate to a charge of 65%, on average, from 25% on fillets to 200% on manufacturing product.



Brexit - the Great Unknown

Possible deal options may include: Remain in Customs Union (tariff-free trade with EU) Free Trade Agreement ariffs: zero-rate, preferential rate or quota Long transitional arrangements May also impact on EU CAP budget Food safety & production standards to remain high priority Irish beef seen as a close alternative to British.





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
