Tom Halpin farms 160 acres just outside Kells, Co. Meath. Over the past 6 years the farm has undergone rapid expansion with cow numbers growing from 60 to 100 during this time. The farm has been completing profit monitors for the past 8 years and Tom was a previous participant in the BETTER farm beef programme. The farm has changed from set stocking to a paddock system and grass is measured weekly and recorded on Pasturebase. The farm has changed to finishing all progeny in recent years and conference delegates will see top class cows and progeny from Limousin, Simmental and Charolais bulls. Tom is helped on the farm by his family and his son Matthew who is currently studying agricultural science in UCD.
